FOREWORD

I am not sure when I first heard about Helene Hadsell, but if you spend any time as part of the contest community, eventually, you do. How could you not? Helene was famous for winning every contest she entered and prize she desired, including a fully furnished home.

Sometime in the early 2000s, I was given a used copy of The Name It & Claim It Game. I felt very lucky as it had not been in print since 1988. I devoured it.

It wasn't my first introduction to positive thinking, visualization, mental projection, goal setting, etc. When I turned eighteen, my dad gave me my first motivational book, telling me, "If I can teach you at eighteen what I learned at thirty-six, you'll be way ahead of me."

After years of self-study, I concluded that my purpose was to teach others two things. First, how to bring more fun and excitement into their everyday lives by winning sweepstakes, and second, how to utilize a wide range of metaphysical methodologies as well as teachers—like Helene—to achieve that magical life.

I started my teaching path in 2004 by writing a book: You Can't Win If You Don't Enter, and also by publishing a newsletter. Then in 2008, I added a blog and a podcast to my platform. Every other Monday for several years, I chatted with the movers and shakers in the promotional industry, eager to share my message.

As I was always seeking dynamic guests for my podcast, I reached out to Helene, and she agreed to be on my show. I

was beyond excited. (The audio interviews were recorded and can be found on my WordsForWinning YouTube channel, along with an entire video playlist here: https://bit.ly/HeleneHadsell.)

After our first interview, I was pretty brazen and bluntly asked Helene if I could come to Texas to meet her in person. She said no. A few days later, I received a phone call from her inviting me to visit. Helene said my spirit guides were so loud that she had to concede. (I'm loud in life, so it didn't surprise me that my spirit guides are also loud.)

That November, I found myself in Alvarado, Texas, in the presence of this amazing woman. To me, women like Helene were the original teachers of spirituality. Helene had mastered not only the Law of Attraction but also the art of manifesting, along with a whole slew of other extraordinary metaphysical skills. It's that very mastery that she imparts in all of her books. Helene also felt 'if she could do it, you could do it.' Although the hobby itself has changed tremendously over the past 50 years, the mind-mastery skills and the life lessons Helene imparts are timeless.

During my visit, Helene suggested that I pick up her gauntlet and start sharing with others what she had been teaching for decades. She didn't see herself teaching in person again and didn't want her messages to pass with her. I didn't do anything with her suggestion until now.

Because I interviewed her, wrote about her, and shared her teachings over the years, I received many requests for Helene's books, courses, and Blueprint readings. Finally, it was time for me to stop holding the gauntlet

It is important to me that I maintain the integrity of Helene's work, so I've made only minor adjustments in this edition. I reformatted her book for current publishing methods (Print On Demand, Kindle, Kobo, Google Books, and Apple Books), added notes where required, and included a Recommended Reading section at the end so you may continue to learn and grow.

I've also made it easy for you to distinguish Helene's words from mine. All of Helene's are in Arial font. All of my words are in Times Roman font.

Just like Helene, it is my hope you understand her teachings and not only become a prize winner but a big winner in the game of life.

When I arrived at her doorstep, it was past dinner time. Helene was so sweet. She kept a plate warm for me, good home cooking. We sat at the table and talked about my day while I ate.


Then I got the tour. It was an open-concept home, and in the center was her conference area. This is where she held her workshops. I could only imagine what it would have been like to attend an original WINeuvers for WISHcraft workshop.

When Helene hosted full weekend seminars, she had a guest house for the students. As it was just me, I stayed

in the back guest room.

Saturday, November 15th, 2008

After breakfast, I headed to Starbucks to check in, write, and get a Cinnamon Dolce latte. I brought one back for Helene, extra hot and double-cupped so it would survive the drive. She LOVED it! She had never had a drink from Starbucks or a latte, and I remember how giddy she was sipping her first hot, sweet, foamy drink.

On my way to Starbucks, I spotted a roadside stand selling fresh pecans. Of course, on the way back, I stopped and bought two bags to bring home with me.

When I returned, Helene said she wanted to buy some supplies to create Blueprints. She was out of the photo albums with the sticky pages she used. Off we went on a shopping trip.

I should say adventure. One of Helene's favorite sayings was Helen Keller's quote, "Life is a daring adventure or nothing." Anytime spent with Helene, no matter how mundane on the surface, was an adventure!

Our first stop was Rosa's Café, as by then it was lunchtime. The first thing we spotted when we walked in was a big sign advertising a sweepstakes.

You had to record a 30-second video describing your experience at the café. As Helene didn't have any modern video recording skills, I recorded her entry and submitted it on her behalf. She messaged me a few months later, telling me she had won a secondary prize. She really did win every contest she entered, and I got to witness it firsthand. We ended up going to several Dollar Trees and Dollar Generals, as none of them seemed to have enough of the specific photo albums Helene needed to make her Blueprints. In the end, we found a dozen or so.

Once we got back, we sat and enjoyed afternoon tea. Helene still had her coffee station set up in her kitchen from her workshop days. Coffee maker, kettle, mugs, teas, sugar, etc., all set out for anyone to enjoy a cuppa

anytime they wished. It was the first time I'd ever had Irish Breakfast tea. To this day, it is still one of my favorites.

Later that evening, we watched a Made for TV movie: The Two Mr. Kissels. For some reason, I still remember the whole movie. It may be because, as crazy as the story was, it was based on real-life events.

Helene and I talked during the commercials. I can still see her sitting in her big easy chair with a heating pad on each armrest to keep her warm. I sat on the couch, tucked under a crocheted throw. The following year she mailed me that throw. The note enclosed said I won first prize as the best guest in 2008. I still have the note and throw.

We talked about how she manifested all of her adventures, prizes, and dreams. Helene told me there was one thing she still wanted to do; be a guest on The David Letterman Show. It was one adventure that never manifested for her.

Sunday, November 16th, 2008

I planned my whole trip around this day. Since I was coming to Texas, I thought, "Why not be in town for The DFWinners Sweepstakes Club monthly meeting while visiting Helene?"

Not only did I invite myself to the meeting, but I also invited Helene! Thankfully, the club was thrilled to have me as a guest. They were ecstatic when they discovered Helene was coming with me.

Just as I had done every day on this trip, the first stop on our way to Irving was Starbucks.

While we drank lattes, I worked on my laptop. Helene sure loved the sweet and foamy concoctions Starbucks had to offer. I could only imagine how often she would have been frequenting the store had she discovered them sooner.

Helene didn't want me to take any pictures of her during the trip, but she did let me snap a partial one using my computer camera. (See Helene tucked into the bm right-hand corner?!)



Sadly, the resolution was perfect for the web but not great for print. Even so, I thought the memory was worth sharing.

I might not remember every detail of the weekend, but thankfully, I had the sense to blog about our visit to The DFWinners Sweepstakes Club monthly meeting. Here is what I wrote:

The DFWinners

Last Sunday, I was lucky enough to attend the monthly club meeting of the DFWinners with Helene in tow. (See if you can spot her in any of the pictures.) It was held at the Spring Creek BBQ restaurant in Irving,



Texas. I found their club to be so different from the one I belong to.

My club, The Winner's Circle, only has twelve members. We meet once per month at a local restaurant. We have lunch, chat about the hobby, and have a scratch lottery ticket trade.

This meeting had twenty-nine people in attendance. I'm not sure how many members they have. They have a formal meeting format. Before the meeting starts,

people line up to participate in the draws: stamped postcards, decorated envelopes, scratch tickets, 50/50, and Better Than Nothing. The meeting began with a Roll Call. Each person introduced themselves and what they had won since the last meeting—lots of cheering for each other. Even if someone's wins were low the past month, there were many words of encouragement. They even have a wins board to track how many big wins they have had as a club.



Then I got up and spoke a bit about the hobby and answered questions about how the hobby is different between Canada and the United States. The shortlist of

the differences are the lingo (contestor vs. sweeper), the taxes (in Canada, we do not pay income tax on winnings of any kind), there are virtually no mail-in contests left in Canada, and the number of local sweepstakes where participation is required is far greater.

I discovered later that the part of the meeting I spoke about was their Educational Session, where they learned something new to increase their odds of winning. The previous month they had made shaving cream envelopes.



Then they had their draws. I won the 50/50. WOOHOO! (I bought my daughter pink cowgirl boots with my winnings.)

After all the winning was done, they discussed club business. (The business section was very similar to the business section of my Toastmasters club meetings.) Since it was November, they talked about the Christmas party/meeting and the new executive for the following year. I then realized the four women sitting at the front were the President, Webmaster, Secretary, and Treasurer.

At the very end, Helene stood up and offered to host a few members as guests in her home one Sunday in the new year and teach them firsthand about attracting the wins they really want. They will have a draw for the five winners in January. Everyone was very excited at the prospect of being lucky enough to win an afternoon with Helene!

The two hours went by so fast. Helene and I had so much fun!!

Helene had told me she stopped entering sweepstakes years ago because she won everything she ever wanted. My winning energy was so contagious that by the time I left, we were in the process of winning her a new computer. (I seem to have that effect on people!) So we agreed once she won, my family would all come down for a visit, and we would get her all set up. I plan to ensure our trip coincides with another DFWinners meeting!

If you are traveling, see which sweepstakes clubs are in the area and attend a meeting if possible. It's a great way to be around fellow sweepers in between conventions.

On our way back to Helene's, I spotted a sign for frozen custard. I asked Helene what it was. She said it was similar to ice cream. We were like two little kids as we skipped dinner and ate custard instead. I remember sitting in the car, cups of custard in hand, giggling as we devoured our sweet treat.

Monday, November 17th, 2008

It was time for me to head home. After breakfast, I headed to the airport, but no trip to Texas would be complete without buying a pair of cowboy boots. I stopped at Cavanaugh's Boot City. I bought myself a pair of Justin Boots and my daughter a pair of pink cowgirl boots, which are currently tucked away in her keepsake box.

Sadly, I never saw Helene again. She passed away two years later. I will always be grateful for our time together, the lessons I learned, and the opportunity to share her wit and wisdom with you now.

In 2019 when I received Helene's books from Dike Hadsell to begin the updating and republishing journey, I discovered Helene never stopped writing or teaching. I had a 1988 and a 2003 of *The Name It & Claim It Game*, but I discovered Helene had kept updating the book until 2010. The year she passed away.

As I updated the book I worked from the 2010 digital edition and cross-referenced the 1998 and 2003 editions adding in stories she wrote, plus articles she sent me.

In 2020 I was lucky enough to find a used copy of her 1971 first edition. Then in 2023, as I recorded the Audible book, we needed to reference the print editions. As I was flipping through her first book I noticed a chapter title I didn't recognize *What's Taking You So Long?*

Some of it was new, but some of it was very familiar. Most of the 'missing' chapter can be found in her second book *In Contact With Other Realms*. I assume it was left out of her second 1988 edition for good reason. Therefore, I decided not to re-edit *The Name It & Claim It Game*, and instead create a free PDF download for you. https://bit.ly/HHMissingChapter
